



### Asset class breakdown




#### Market Cap breakdown

#### Portfolio managers comments

European markets lead the world's major markets for the 1st half of 2025 (EUROSTOXX NR +13.40%). This renewed optimism is underpinned by the growth prospects that Germany's new fiscal policy offers Europe, with its plans for investment in defense and infrastructure. It is also based on the continuation of the ECB's monetary easing policy, reversing the Federal Reserve's wait-and-see stance. After deserting the zone for years, international capital is returning in droves. The euro's 13% appreciation against the dollar over the period is also evidence of this major shift in asset allocation in favor of the zone. The geopolitical situation of recent weeks (Israeli strikes on Iran) has ultimately had little impact on the markets, due to the brevity of the conflict and its strict localization.

The DNCA Invest Euro Dividend Grower fund underperformed in June, with a decline of -1.63% versus -0.73% for its benchmark, the MSCI EMU NR. This monthly underperformance was due in particular to declines in the healthcare sector (EssilorLuxottica, Novo Nordisk and Sanofi) and the defense sector (Thales).

During the month, the fund initiated three new positions with the addition to its portfolio of Hermès International (France), Munich Re (Germany) and Wolters Kluwer (Netherlands). Hermès International is a family-owned French company that designs luxury products, mainly in France (leather goods, ready-to-wear and accessories, jewelry), and markets them worldwide through its distribution network and specialized stores. MunichRe is a leading German reinsurance group, providing reinsurance, insurance and asset management services. Wolters Kluwer is a Dutch group that provides technology solutions and access to technical expertise for several business sectors (Law, Finance, Healthcare, Compliance, Tax and Accounting). These 3 groups have a regular dividend payout history of over 20 years, with MunichRe and Wolters Kluwer dividends up by over 30% and 10% respectively this year. The fund is also continuing to strengthen the stocks recently added to its portfolio (ASR Nederland, Buzzi, Iberdrola, Intesa SanPaolo and Terna). Conversely, the main downward adjustments include Compass, EssilorLuxottica, Lottomatica, Relx, Tryg and Vinci; Antin Infrastructure, Richemont and Sodexo have been removed from the selection.

At the end of June, the DNCA Invest Euro Dividend Grower fund is invested at 95.38% and remains concentrated around a top 10 representing 37.3%. The fund is mainly exposed to the "Growth" style with 54.1% and "Value" represents 41.2%. The portfolio's main convictions are: ASML (5.7%), Thales (4.6%), Air Liquide (4.2%), Sanofi (3.6%) and SAP (3.4%).

The financial characteristics of the portfolio show a PER for the year 2025 of 17.12x for expected earnings growth of +8.7%; dividends paid in 2025 are estimated to rise by +13.5% for a yield of 2.82%. The extra-financial characteristics show a responsibility performance of 5.7 and a sustainable transition exposure of 80.58%.

The high-risk environment in which the markets are evolving justifies maintaining a cautious policy. While the risk of an extreme tariff shock can now be dismissed, the negative repercussions of US trade policy are still ahead of us. And global growth could well end up suffering from the prevailing uncertainty. As far as the European markets are concerned, most of the upside factors already seem to be well integrated into current valuations. What's more, the microeconomic panorama offers little support, with earnings prospects regularly revised downwards. The coming earnings season will therefore be crucial in confirming or correcting the positive trend of recent months.






## Responsibility risk breakdown(1)



#### Selectivity universe exclusion rate




#### Transition/CSR exposure(2)




SUSTAINABLE TRANSITION EXPOSURE (% Revenue)

#### Analysis methodology

We develop proprietary models based on our expertise and conviction to add tangible value in the selection of portfolio securities. DNCA's ESG analysis model, Above & Beyond Analysis (ABA), respects this principle and offers a rating that we control the entire construction. Information from companies is the main input to our rating. The methodologies for calculating ESG indicators and our responsible investor and engagement policy are available on our website by clicking here.

(1) The rating out of 10 integrates 4 risks of responsibility: shareholder, environmental, social and societal. Whatever their sector of activity, 24 indicators are evaluated, such as social climate, accounting risks, suppliers, business ethics, energy policy, quality of management.

(2) The ABA Matrix combines the Responsibility Risk and the Sustainable Transition exposure of the portfolio. It allows us to It allows companies to be mapped using a risk/opportunity approach.

#### Glossary

Beta. Measures the average extent to which a fund moves relative to the broader market. The beta of a market is 1. A fund with a beta of more than 1 moves on average to a greater extent than the market. A fund with a beta of less than 1 moves on average to a lesser extent. If beta is a minus number, it is likely that the stock and the market move in opposite

Correlation coefficient. The correlation coefficient is a measure of correlation. It is used to determine the relationship between two assets over a given period. A positive coefficient means that the two assets move in the same direction. Conversely, a negative coefficient means that the assets move in the opposite direction. The correlation or decorrelation can be more or less strong and varies between -1 and 1.

Dividend yield. Annual dividends per share / Price per share

EV (Enterprise Value). Market value of common stock + market value of preferred equity + market value of debt + minority interest - cash and investments.

ND/EBITDA (Net Debt / EBITDA). A measurement of leverage, calculated as a company's interest-bearing liabilities minus cash or cash equivalents, divided by its EBITDA. The net debt to EBITDA ratio is a debt ratio that shows how many years it would take for a company to pay back its debt if net debt and EBITDA are held constant.

P/B. The Price to Book Ratio is the ratio of the market value of equity (market capitalisation) to its book value. It is used to compare the market valuation of a company with its book

P/CF (Share price/Cash Flow per Share). The price-to-cash-flow ratio is an indicator of a stock's valuation.

PER (Price Earnings Ratio). A company's share price divided by the amount of profits it makes for each share in a 12-month period. PE ratios are normally calculated on the base of all the profit made in the period, whether or not the profit is paid out to shareholders in that period.

ROE (Return On Equity). The amount of net income returned as a percentage of shareholders equity. Return on equity measures a corporation's profitability by revealing how much profit a company generates with the money shareholders have invested.

Sharpe Ratio. A way of measuring the historical risk-adjusted return on an investment. It is the average previous return minus the risk-free return, divided by the standard deviation (a measure of risk that looks at the diversion of actual returns from expected returns). Sharpe Ratio. The Sharpe ratio measures the excess return over the risk-free money rate of an asset portfolio divided by the standard deviation of that return. It is therefore a measure of the marginal return per unit of risk. It is used to measure the performance of managers with different risk policies.

Tracking error. Tracking Error is a measure of how closely an investment portfolio follows the index against which it is benchmarked. It is the difference in the return earned by a portfolio and the return earned by the benchmark against which the portfolio is constructed. For example, if a bond portfolio earns a return of 5.15% during a period when the portfolio's benchmark (say, for example, the Lehman Brothers Index) produces a return of 5.06%, the tracking error is .09%, or 9 basis points.
