### What is this product?

#### TYPE OF PRODUCT:

The product is a Sub-Fund of DNCA Invest (the "Fund"), an Undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS) under the laws of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg.

#### TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration and liquidation must be decided upon by the Board of Directors.

#### OBJECTIVES

The investment objective of the Sub-fund is to seek performance by investing in equities leading listed real estate and traded in the major stock markets of developed European countries, over the recommended investment term of 5 years. These companies are chosen according to an SRI approach for the quality of their economic fundamentals, for their quality of global or local leaders on their respective markets analyzed through the systematic integration of environmental, social / societal and governance (ESG) criteria (such as energy consumption, CO2 emission), or even ethical practices of society.

The investment strategy is based on active and discretionary management style. The Sub-Fund promotes environmental and/or social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. Additional information on SRI strategy may be obtained in the prospectus of the Sub-fund. The Sub-Fund may at any time be exposed to: equities and similar or rights having their registered office or domiciled in Euro zone countries, from 80 to 105% of its net assets; Equities from issuers having their registered office or domiciled outside Euro zone countries (including emerging countries): up to 20% of its net assets (directly or through UCI); Equities with small capitalization (below 1 billion EUR or any other currency) up to 50% of its net assets. Fixed income securities from issuers of the public or private sector having their registered office in a country which is a OECD member state, depending on market opportunities, and having at the time of the purchase a Standard & Poor's rating of at least A3 short term rating or A- long-term rating, or being considered as equivalent by the Management Company using similar criteria, or through bonds and money market funds: up to 25% of its net assets; deposits: up to 25% of its net assets; other financial instruments (within the meaning of Article 41 (2) a) of the Law) up to 10 % of its net assets. The Sub-Fund can be exposed to all currencies other than the Euro, bringing the exchange risk to 20% maximum of its net assets. The Sub-Fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets in units and/or shares of UCITS and/or other UCIs and/or regulated AIFs open to non-professional investors and/or ETFs. In order to achieve the investment objective, the Sub-Fund may also invest in equities or related financial derivative instruments as well as in convertible bonds, warrants and rights which may embed derivatives, for the purpose of hedging or increasing equity and currency exchange risk without seeking overexposure.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed. This means the Management Company is taking investment decisions with the intention of achieving the Sub-Fund's investment objective; this may include decisions regarding asset selection and overall level of exposure to the market. The investment universe of the Sub-Fund is limited by the constituents of the benchmark but the Sub-Fund may take positions whose weightings diverge from the benchmark. The deviation from the benchmark may be significant. The reference benchmark does not intend to be consistent with the environmental or social characteristics promoted by the Sub-Fund.

#### INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS:

The product is suitable for retail investors with limited knowledge of the underlying financial instruments and no financial industry experience. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

#### OTHER INFORMATION:

The Depositary is BNP Paribas, Luxembourg Branch.

The redemption of shares may be requested each day.

Distributable amounts (net income and realised net capital gains or losses) are fully capitalised each year.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### RISK INDICATOR



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

### COSTS OVER TIME

### Recommended Holding Period (RHP): 5 years.

Redemptions for Shares in the Sub-Fund can be made on any Business Day. Applications for redemptions will normally be satisfied on the Business Day following the applicable Valuation Day, provided that the application is received by 12.00 noon (Luxembourg time) on the Valuation Day.
